



## OED's Evaluation Capacity Building initiatives in Member Countries

n addition to its function as financier, IsDB is a knowledge bank, and its Operations Evaluation Department has contributed to helping Member Countries strengthen their monitoring and evaluation systems and capacities at all levels to allow them to generate and use evaluative evidence for more effective policies

#### PURPOSE

- ▶ Significant economic progress has been made by many Member Countries (MCs) over the past decades, enabling them to move towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). However, the mechanisms for monitoring and evaluation of those interventions have not developed at the same pace, leaving the governments lagging in measuring the results.
- ▶ Through its Operations Evaluation Department (OED), IsDB has leveraged its expertise and experience in Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) to help MCs improve their M&E systems and results measurement capacities.
- Evaluation Capacity Development initiatives have been undertaken that aim to develop:
- A culture of evidence-based decision making in the MCs
- M&E systems within MCs
- The evaluation capacity of public institutions as well evaluation professionals.

Through the capacity development of public officials from the Member Countries in results measurement, OED helps implement Awareness, Competency, Delivery and Reinforcement

▶ These activities are aligned with the Awareness, Linkages, Competency, Delivery and Reinforcement components of the P5P, demonstrable within the Bank's activities in Bahrain, Kazakhstan, Morocco and Senegal.

#### METHOD

- ► The OED works diligently to identify the need for capacity development in the areas of monitoring, evaluation and impact assessment in the MCs. In addition to the supply-driven approach, OED responds in several cases to the demands of MCs.
- ▶ In concert with partners such as the World Bank, capacity development programmes, including tailored workshops, case studies, simulations, and M&E systems development support are designed to suit the specific needs of the MCs.
- ► Efforts to impart capacity development initiatives often combined classroom training with practical evaluation experience. In the case of the Court of Audit, Morocco, participants had the opportunity to act as external members of the OED evaluation team
- ▶ In some cases, OED collaborated with government agencies to transform them into centres of excellence for capacity development in M&E, preparing the agency officials in turn to train other officials to shift the country's decision- and policy-making systems into evidence-based activities.
- The court of Audits in Morocco and the Astana International Financial Centre in Kazakhstan are now equipped with the





capacity to train other agencies, resulting in a cascading effect of capacity development initiatives.

▶ IsDB has joined the Global Evaluation Initiative, a broad and inclusive group of national governments, international and regional organisations, private sector organisations, academic institutions and civil society groups that have formed a global partnership aiming at closing the M&E gap and strengthening capacities at all levels in order to generate and use evaluative evidence for more effective policies in the MCs.

#### ACHIEVEMENTS

- Through capacity development programmes in Bahrain, Kazakhstan, Morocco and Senegal, OED trained a total 130 mid- and senior-level officials from nine MCs.
- ▶ OED's interventions have been designed based on a deep understanding of underlying issues and are thus tailored to the local contexts of the specific countries.
- ► Training in Monitoring and Evaluation for government officials of the Kingdom of Bahrain Responding to the desire of the government of the Kingdom of Bahrain for improving results, OED delivered an intensive workshop to familiarise government officials with the Theory

of Change and enhance their capacity to deliver, monitor and evaluate project outcomes. 27 senior officials from the Ministry of Finance and the executing agencies of line ministries participated in the workshop.

for 30 participants from different
sectors and ministries, including
Astana officials. The workshop was
aimed at equipping participants with
technical skills in evaluation and their
practical applications in development
projects. Participants gained deeper
understanding of evaluation methods
and techniques and their application
to project management.

Moroccan Court of Audit

The Moroccan Court of Audit has recently been mandated to evaluate public sector projects and policies for the government of Morocco. The initiative supported the Moroccan Court of Audit in preparing 28 magistrates to become experts in the evaluation of government projects, strategies and policies through classroom training and hands-on experience provided by OED. The programme succeeded in strengthening the institutional evaluation capacity of the Court of Audit through development of an evaluation manual, related tools and procedures and guidance on four pilot evaluations conducted by the Court of Audit. Systems have been put in place to support evidence-based decision-making, organisational learning and accountability.



GEMS systematically builds client capacity in the creation of customized digital data collection and monitoring systems, to contribute to effective planning, real-time M&E and remote supervision of operations, and close data gaps along the project cycle



Focuses on local capacity-building and client ownership for customized use of digital technology and related skills



Utilizes cost-free open-source tools and hand-held devices (smartphones/tablets)





## Objective of the program

- ✓ Six months-long hands-on training program for young professionals interested in evaluation career
- ✓ Interns to gain work experience and benefit from broader learning opportunities and professional networks across the GEI Network

## Pilot phase



- ✓ Pilot program launched in July, 2022
- ✓ Host institutions are the CLEAR Centers

- ✓ Interns placed in:
  - Clear AA
  - Clear LAB (Mozambique and Brazil)
  - Clear FA
  - Clear SA

# What are the expectations of interns?



- ✓ Gain practical M&E experience
- ✓ Benefit from senior evaluators' mentorship
- ✓ Expand their professional network
- ✓ Enhance their evaluation planning and management skills

## Challenges



- ✓ Finding candidates: pool of candidates, dissemination of information
- ✓ Hiring is challanging especially when interns are not from host country
- ✓ Findings best ways of exposing interns to broader GEI network

- ✓ Operations' manual including procedure, recommendations and lessons learned currently being drafted
- ✓ Fund raising to expand the program next year





## Browse courses by type of degree











#### **Lines of action**

  - Learning materials (public goods)
